A Little History About ASD

The American School for the Deaf is a private non-profit pre-K to grade 12 school for Deaf and Hard of Hearing students. ASD was founded in 1817 by Mason Fitch Cogswell, along with Thomas Hopkins Gallaudet and Laurent Clerc, to teach his deaf daughter, Alice. ASD was the first school for the deaf in the country that continues in operation today. ASD was also the first special education and first racially integrated school in CT. ASD is the birthplace of American Sign Language! Using an ASL/English Bilingual approach, ASD nourishes the whole child—intellectually, emotionally, physically and socially—in its new, state-of-the-art educational facility. ASD is celebrating its 200th anniversary this year of empowering Deaf and Hard of Hearing students to be **‘ALL ways able.’**
